

## Round table "Towards low-sulphur fuel for inland waterways transport in Europe" 3 May 2007 Strasbourg, Palais du Rhin

The purpose of the Round Table is to determine the conditions for introducing lowsulphur fuel that are in alignment with the further development of inland waterway transport in Europe. The positions of the stakeholders will be clarified and the proposal of the European Commission (COM(2007) 18 final) will be discussed.
